An Interpretation & Report (I&R) CPT Code 92283 is not required for Medicare. However, you may find that the following documentation will make it easier to track test results and see progression:

Rabin Cone test ordered to evaluate...

- -macular function in dry AMD, diabetic retinopathy, etc. patient
- -visual pathway function in patient with MS
- -cataract impairment
- -high-risk drug management
- -macular function in patient with night vision, contrast sensitivity complaint
- Technician: Chris Johnson, COA
- Reliability of Test*:
 - -Extended response times were consistent with moderately degraded cone function OD
 - -Normal response times OS
 - -No environmental interference
- Patient Cooperation: Good patient cooperation with no distractions or user errors
- Test Findings*:
 - -2 cone types moderately degraded OD consistent with dry AMD; 0 cone types degraded OS
 - -No cone types degraded OU showing retinal health preservation despite dry AMD
- Assessment/ Diagnosis*: Cone function showed degradation since last visit, OD. No change OS.
- Impact on Treatment/Prognosis*:
 - -Begin AREDS II formula
 - -Discuss recommended lifestyle change
 - -Adjust medications
 - -Recommend evaluation by neuro ophthalmologist
 - -Order additional testing
